SOUVENIRS OF PARIS, 1950

The most widely performed of Claudia's cabaret theatre programs introduces Marcelle, a Parisian cabaret owner who recounts through song and spoken word the events of her life in France before and after World War II. The musical revue features songs made famous by Edith Piaf, Juliette Gréco and Yves Montand and songs celebrating the Paree of American composers Cole Porter, Duke Ellington, and Vernon Duke. Our *Study Guide* is a great tool to prepare for the show and reflect after the show.

PARIS IN THE JAZZ AGE, 1910-1940

Claudia and accompanist take a romp through the "crazy years" of France between World Wars, celebrating the lifestyles and fashion of the decade. The program pays homage to the era of the cakewalk, ragtime, the Charleston & Swing with artists Josephine Baker, Ada "Bricktop" Smith, Mistinguett, Maurice Chevalier, Cole Porter, Duke Ellington, and Darius Milhaud. The show touches on race relations in France and America as well as the dark side of depression and war.
